

Adrian Cunningham (ed.), The Arrangement and Description of Archives Amid Administrative and Technological Change: Essays by and about Peter Scott, Australian Society of Archivists, Brisbane, 2010.

For the first time, all of Peter Scott's published writings on archives have been collected into a single volume, together with texts of previously unpublished talks and university lectures and a major new piece of writing by Peter Scott completed in 2010 which provides a comprehensive update and overview of his archival thinking and contributions.

Rounding out this book are new essays by Australia's Barbara Reed and Canada's Laura Millar, reflecting upon the continuing impact and relevance of Scott's innovations in the twenty-first century, and a bibliography of writings about the series system. Editor Adrian Cunningham has worked closely with Scott to assemble this 400-page book that will serve as a fitting legacy for Australia's most significant archival thinker, writer and practitioner.
