Brian Sydney Baldwin, M.A. (Cantab.), A.L.A.A. (Archives), joined the South Australian Archives in 1960 and has acted as Principal Archivist for extended periods, the longest being from 1976 to 1979. In 1963 he and his wife spent eight months at the Archives Nationales and made a survey of records throughout France relating to South Australia. Copies of the resulting 35 reels of microfilm have been acquired by most of the major libraries in Australia.
