The *Macquarie Dictionary* is used for basic style and spelling. Footnotes should follow the style as used in the current issue of *Archives and Manuscripts*. Failure to follow this style means a lot of extra work for the Editor. Please ensure that bibliographical details are given in full and spelt out. Commonly used initials such as LAA or ASA are not acceptable in an international journal.

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Please also supply with the article a short abstract, approximately 100 words, and a note for 'About the Contributors'.

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
