INTRODUCTION

This Index has been prepared for the Archives Section of the Library Association of Australia by Miss J.D. Hine, B.A., A.L.A.A., who is in charge of the Cataloguing Department at the Library of New South Wales, in Sydney. Miss Hine has already done invaluable work in indexing, on behalf of the Library Association of Australia, various annual volumes of the Australian Library Journal, as well as in compiling the larger Index to volumes 1 - 14 of that Journal. Much the same principles as Miss Hine used in compiling the Aust. Lib. J. Index have been adopted for the Archives and Manuscripts Index.

Dates have been omitted from the citations, which give only volume, number (in parentheses) and pages. The following collation relates particular issues to their dates:-

Users referring to the re-issued versions of vol. 1, nos 1 - 6, should note that the pagination in these re-issues varies slightly from that in the originals, cited in this Index. These re-issues were prepared between May 1962 and February 1966.

The present Editor wishes to place on record his appreciation of the work of Miss J.D. Hine in preparing the entries for this Index, and of the work of Miss J.M. Murray, B.A., A.L.A.A., former Executive Secretary of the Association, who helped Miss Hine in proof-reading.

Furthermore, a tribute should be paid to the founders of this Journal, Miss P. Mander Jones, who was at the time

Mitchell Librarian, Public Library of New South Wales, and Mr A.R. Horton, who was then Archives Officer in the same Library. These two persons shared editorial responsibility for the first two numbers. The Editor during the period December 1956 to November 1959 was Mr H.J. Gibbney, then of the Commonwealth Archives Office, who at present, as a member of the staff of the Australian Dictionary of Biography (Australian National University) continues to place his detailed knowledge of the sources of Australian history at the disposal of the Editor, and makes many useful suggestions about possible contributors to the Journal.

Archives and Manuscripts is now being issued twice a year (in May and November). The first issue of the current volume (vol. 4, no 1) was issued in November 1969. The Journal is available on a subscription basis - \$1.00 per annum to members of the Library Association of Australia, and \$2.00 per annum to non-members. Orders may be placed with the Editor, Archives and Manuscripts, c/- Archives, Australian National University, P.O. Box 4, Canberra, A.C.T. Australia 2600. Cheques should be made payable to Archives and Manuscripts, or to the Archives Section, L.A.A., and NOT to the Australian National University.

Limited stocks of back issues are available, but not copies of vol. 2, no 5 (June 1963). Current subscribers may order back issues at the rate of 50¢ per copy. The Journal went into letterpress at vol. 2, no 5; and into offset at vol. 4, no 1.
